Dear Ms. Hill:

This is a Final Order by Default issued by the Secretary of State (secretary) for your failure to file a timely supplemental contribution and expenditure report for 2005.

On May 26, 2006, the secretary notified Verizon Good Government Club of Oregon (committee), pursuant to ORS 260.232(2), that it had failed to file the report and that the secretary may impose a civil penalty. An opportunity for a hearing was provided in that notice; however, no request for a hearing was received by the secretary within the time permitted in the notice. Accordingly, after consideration of the records and files of the secretary regarding this matter, the secretary is entering the following Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The committee's Statement of Organization (SEL 221), applicable during the reporting period, was filed with the secretary on June 18, 2004. The statement reported Virginia K. Hill as the treasurer and PO Box 1100, Beaverton, OR 97075-1100 as the address to which all committee correspondence was to be sent.
2. The committee was required to file a supplemental report with the secretary on September 12, 2005.
3. The secretary sent the committee a notice that it had failed to file a timely report on September 13, 2005. The notice was sent by first class mail to the treasurer at the above-referenced address.

4. The secretary received the report on October 3, 2005, which is 15 business days after the date on which the report was due.
5. The committee reported total contributions of \$5,617.71 and no expenditures during the accounting period for the report.
6. On May 26, 2006, the secretary sent the committee a Notice of Proposed Civil Penalty. The notice was sent by both certified and first class mail to the treasurer at the above-referenced address. The notice proposed a civil penalty of \$1,000.00 and allowed the committee 20 days to request a hearing. On June 1, 2006, the notice sent by certified mail was returned not deliverable as addressed. On June 9, 2006, the secretary spoke with the treasurer and confirmed receipt of the first class mail.
7. The committee did not request a public hearing or submit notarized testimony in lieu of a public hearing.
8. June 9, 2006, the secretary received an amended SEL 221 updating the committee name to Verizon Employees Good Government Club of Oregon and mailing address to 20575 NW Von Neumann Dr, Ste 150, Beaverton, OR 97006.
9. The notice of proposed civil penalty erroneously stated a calculated penalty of \$2,527.95. The actual calculated penalty should have been \$4,213.20 ( $\$5,617.71 \times 5\% \times 15 \text{ days}$ ), because this is the treasurer's third violation, not the second violation as stated in the notice.
10. The secretary has record of two previous late filing during the two-year period beginning September 15, 2003.

#### ULTIMATE FINDINGS OF FACT

Virginia K. Hill, Treasurer, failed to file a timely supplemental contribution and expenditure report for 2005.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Treasurer Virginia K. Hill's failure to file a timely supplemental contribution and expenditure report for 2005 violated ORS 260.073.

By statute, a maximum \$10,000 civil penalty may be imposed for this violation. The *2004 Campaign Finance Manual*, which contains a penalty calculation matrix on pages 101 and 102, is designated in OAR 165-012-0005 as the procedure manual for Oregon campaign finance regulations.

Under the penalty matrix, the maximum statutory penalty of \$10,000 is reduced to 5% of the total contributions or total expenditures—whichever is greater—for each business day the report was late as this is the second late violation by the treasurer.

Although the calculated penalty for the late report is \$4,213.20 ( $\$5,617.71 \times 5\% \times 15 \text{ days}$ ), the penalty matrix sets a maximum penalty of \$1,000.00 when the total contributions or total expenditures—whichever is greater—is between \$2,000.01 and \$10,000.

ORDER

It is ordered that a penalty of \$1,000.00 is assessed. If your payment is not received within 60 days from the date of service noted below, this Order will be sent to our accounting division for collection and may be subsequently sent to the Oregon Department of Revenue.

Please refer to case number L8474 when mailing your payment.

RIGHT TO JUDICIAL REVIEW

You have the right to appeal this Order to the Oregon Court of Appeals pursuant to ORS 183.482. To appeal you must file a petition for judicial review with the Court of Appeals within 60 days from the day this Order was served to you. Because this Order was mailed to you, the date of service is the day it was *mailed*, not the day you received it. If you do not file a petition for judicial review within the 60-day time period, you will lose your right to appeal.
