Dear Mr. Bryan:

This is a Final Order by Default issued by the Secretary of State (secretary) for your failure to file a timely second pre-election contribution and expenditure report for the November 7, 2006, General Election.

On April 12, 2007, the secretary notified the Oregon Federation of College Republicans (committee), pursuant to ORS 260.232(2), that it had failed to file the report and that the secretary may impose a civil penalty. An opportunity for a hearing was provided in that notice; however, no request for a hearing was received by the secretary within the time permitted in the notice. Accordingly, after consideration of the records and files of the secretary regarding this matter, the secretary is entering the following Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The committee's Statement of Organization (SEL 221), applicable during the reporting period, was filed with the secretary on January 23, 2006. The statement reported Keith Bryan as the treasurer and 2770 E 16th Ave, Eugene, OR 97403 as the address to which all committee correspondence was to be sent.
2. The committee was required to file a second pre-election report with the secretary on October 26, 2006.
3. The secretary sent the committee a notice that it had failed to file a timely report on October 27, 2006. The notice was sent by first class mail to the treasurer at the above-referenced address, 2770 E 16th Ave, Eugene, OR 97403.

4. The secretary received by returned mail from the United State Post Office the notice that the committee failed to file a timely report on November 3, 2006. The committee was contacted and 1585 Ferry St, Unit 1, Eugene, OR 97401 was given as the address to send committee correspondence.
5. The secretary received the report on November 27, 2006, which is 19 business days after the date on which the report was due.
6. The committee reported total contributions of \$6,702.48 and total expenditures of \$7,032.17 during the accounting period for the report.
7. The secretary received a statement of organization January 2, 2007, updating the mailing address to PO Box 789, Salem, OR 97308 and John Swanson as treasurer.
8. On April 12, 2007, the secretary sent the committee a Notice of Proposed Civil Penalty. The notice was sent by both certified and first class mail to the treasurer at the above-referenced address. The notice proposed a civil penalty of \$70.32 and allowed the committee 20 days to request a hearing. The notice sent by certified mail was received and signed for by Shawn Cleave on April 13, 2007.
9. The committee did not request a public hearing or submit notarized testimony in lieu of a public hearing.
10. The secretary has record of no previous late filings during the two-year period beginning September 15, 2003.

ULTIMATE FINDINGS OF FACT

Keith Bryan, Treasurer, failed to file a timely second pre-election contribution and expenditure report for the November 7, 2006, General Election.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Treasurer Keith Bryan's failure to file a timely second pre-election contribution and expenditure report for the November 7, 2006, General Election violated ORS 260.073.

By statute, a maximum \$10,000 civil penalty may be imposed for this violation. The *2004 Campaign Finance Manual*, which contains a penalty calculation matrix on pages 101 and 102, is designated in OAR 165-012-0005 as the procedure manual for Oregon campaign finance regulations.

Under the penalty matrix, the maximum statutory penalty of \$10,000 is reduced to 1% of the total contributions or total expenditures—whichever is greater—for each business day the report was late as this is the first late violation by the treasurer.

ORDER

Payment of the proposed civil penalty of \$70.32 was received in the office of the Secretary of State on June 13, 2007. This Order will serve as your receipt and this matter is now considered closed.

RIGHT TO JUDICIAL REVIEW

You have the right to appeal this Order to the Oregon Court of Appeals pursuant to ORS 183.482. To appeal you must file a petition for judicial review with the Court of Appeals within 60 days from the day this Order was served to you. Because this Order was mailed to you, the date of service is the day it was *mailed*, not the day you received it. If you do not file a petition for judicial review within the 60-day time period, you will lose your right to appeal.
