Dear Ms. Campbell:

This is a Final Order by Default issued by the Secretary of State (secretary) for your failure to file a timely post-election contribution and expenditure report for the November 7, 2006, General Election.

On June 13, 2007, the secretary notified Future Leaders of Oregon PAC (committee), pursuant to ORS 260.232(2), that it had failed to file the report and that the secretary may impose a civil penalty. An opportunity for a hearing was provided in that notice; however, no request for a hearing was received by the secretary within the time permitted in the notice. Accordingly, after consideration of the records and files of the secretary regarding this matter, the secretary is entering the following Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The committee's Statement of Organization (SEL 221), applicable during the reporting period, was filed with the secretary on December 15, 2000. The statement reported Joleen Campbell as the treasurer and 940 Main St Ste E, Lebanon, OR 97355 as the address to which all committee correspondence was to be sent. Mail was returned from this address, however, and on July 7, 2006, the secretary was notified of the address at PO Box 2526, Lebanon, OR 97355, although the committee did not properly amend their Statement of Organization.
2. The committee was required to file a post-election report with the secretary on December 7, 2006.
3. The secretary sent the committee a notice that it had failed to file a timely report on December 8, 2006. The notice was sent by first class mail to the treasurer at the above-referenced address.

4. The secretary received the report on December 11, 2006, which is two business days after the date on which the report was due.
5. The committee reported no contributions or expenditures during the accounting period for the report.
6. In June of 2007, mail was returned from the post office box in Lebanon. The committee has been notified of the incorrect address, but has not properly amended their Statement of Organization. The secretary now uses the committee's physical address at 69 West Ash St, Lebanon, OR 97355 as the mailing address. This notice is also copied to 645 Wagon Wheel Dr, Lebanon, OR 97355, the address listed on the post-election report.
7. On June 13, 2007, the secretary sent the committee a Notice of Proposed Civil Penalty. The notice was sent by both certified and first class mail to the treasurer at the above-referenced address. The notice proposed a civil penalty of \$50.00 and allowed the committee 20 days to request a hearing. The notice sent by certified mail was returned unclaimed and the post office indicated it gave first notice on June 14, 2007.
8. The committee did not request a public hearing or submit notarized testimony in lieu of a public hearing.
9. The secretary has record of one previous late filing during the two-year period beginning September 15, 2005.

#### ULTIMATE FINDINGS OF FACT

Joleen Campbell, Treasurer, failed to file a timely post-election contribution and expenditure report for the November 7, 2006, General Election.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Treasurer Joleen Campbell's failure to file a timely post-election contribution and expenditure report for the November 7, 2006, General Election violated ORS 260.073.

By statute, a maximum \$10,000 civil penalty may be imposed for this violation. The *2006 Campaign Finance Manual*, which contains a penalty calculation matrix on pages 104–106, is designated in OAR 165-012-0005 as the procedure manual for Oregon campaign finance regulations.

Under the penalty matrix, the maximum statutory penalty of \$10,000 is reduced to 3% of the total contributions or total expenditures—whichever is greater—for each business day the report was late as this is the second late violation by the treasurer.

Although the committee reported no activity during the accounting period for the late report, the penalty matrix sets a minimum penalty of \$50.00 for a candidate's or treasurer's second late violation.

It is ordered that a penalty of \$50.00 is assessed. If your payment is not received within 60 days from the date of service noted below, this Order will be sent to our accounting division for collection and may be subsequently sent to the Oregon Department of Revenue.

#### RIGHT TO JUDICIAL REVIEW

You have the right to appeal this Order to the Oregon Court of Appeals pursuant to ORS 183.482. To appeal you must file a petition for judicial review with the Court of Appeals within 60 days from the day this Order was served to you. Because this Order was mailed to you, the date of service is the day it was *mailed*, not the day you received it. If you do not file a petition for judicial review within the 60-day time period, you will lose your right to appeal.
