Dear Ms. Spicer:

This is a Final Order by Default issued by the Secretary of State (secretary) for your failure to file a complete first supplement to the second pre-election contribution and expenditure report for the November 7, 2006, General Election.

On May 16, 2007, the secretary notified the Committee to Elect Ann Spicer Circuit Judge (committee), pursuant to ORS 260.232(2), that it had failed to file the report and that the secretary may impose a civil penalty. An opportunity for a hearing was provided in that notice; however, no request for a hearing was received by the secretary within the time permitted in the notice. Accordingly, after consideration of the records and files of the secretary regarding this matter, the secretary is entering the following Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The committee's Statement of Organization (SEL 220), applicable during the reporting period, was filed with the secretary on March 7, 2006. The statement reported William J. Kuhn as the treasurer and PO Box 428, Heppner, OR 97836 as the mailing address for both candidate and committee correspondence.
2. The committee was required to file a first supplement to the second pre-election report with the secretary on October 30, 2006, because it received a contribution exceeding \$500 from a single source or made expenditures of more than \$1,000 to a single payee between October 23 and November 2, 2006.

3. The committee reported the contributions (\$750.00 from William J. Kuhn and \$750.00 from Annetta L. Spicer on October 24, 2006) and an expenditure (\$1,500.00 to Bill Money Voice Broadcast on October 23, 2006) on its post-election report filed on December 6, 2006, which is 25 business days late.
4. On May 16, 2007, the secretary sent the committee a Notice of Proposed Civil Penalty. The notice was sent by both certified and first class mail to the candidate and was sent by first class mail to the treasurer at the above-referenced address. The notice proposed a civil penalty of \$100.00 and allowed the committee 20 days to request a hearing. The notice sent by certified mail was received and signed for by Annetta L. Spicer on May 18, 2007.
5. The committee did not request a public hearing or submit notarized testimony in lieu of a public hearing.
6. The secretary has record of one previous late filing during the two-year period beginning September 15, 2005.

ULTIMATE FINDINGS OF FACT

Annetta L. Spicer, Candidate, and William J. Kuhn, Treasurer, failed to file a complete first supplement to the second pre-election contribution and expenditure report for the November 7, 2006, General Election.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Candidate Annetta L. Spicer's and Treasurer William J. Kuhn's failure to file a complete first supplement to the second pre-election contribution and expenditure report for the November 7, 2006, General Election violated ORS 260.068.

By statute, a maximum \$10,000 civil penalty may be imposed for this violation. The *2006 Campaign Finance Manual*, which contains a penalty calculation matrix on pages 104–106, is designated in OAR 165-012-0005 as the procedure manual for Oregon campaign finance regulations.

Under the penalty matrix, the maximum statutory penalty of \$10,000 is reduced to 3% of the total contributions or total expenditures—whichever is greater—for each business day the report was late as this is the second late violation by the candidate.

Although the calculated penalty for the late report is \$1,125.00 ($\$1,500.00 \times 3\% \times 25$ days), the penalty matrix sets a maximum penalty of \$100.00 when the total contributions or total expenditures—whichever is greater—is between \$0 and \$2,000.

ORDER

Payment of the proposed civil penalty of \$100.00 was received in the office of the Secretary of State on May 31, 2007. This Order will serve as your receipt and this matter is now considered closed.

RIGHT TO JUDICIAL REVIEW

You have the right to appeal this Order to the Oregon Court of Appeals pursuant to ORS 183.482. To appeal you must file a petition for judicial review with the Court of Appeals within 60 days from the day this Order was served to you. Because this Order was mailed to you, the date of service is the day it was *mailed*, not the day you received it. If you do not file a petition for judicial review within the 60-day time period, you will lose your right to appeal.
